

Monday, November 8, 2010

The regular meeting of the Humboldt County Board of Commissioners was called to order on Monday November 8, 2010, at 9:30 a.m. in the regular place of meeting at the Courthouse, Winnemucca, Nevada. Those present were Chairman Chuck Giordano, Commissioners Garley Amos Jr., Dan Cassinelli, Tom Fransway and Mike Bell, District Attorney Russell Smith, Administrator Bill Deist and Clerk of the Board Tami Rae Spero.

DISCUSSION & ACTION ON CORRECTION/APPROVAL OF MINUTES - OCTOBER 4, 2010 REGULAR MEETING, OCTOBER 12, 2010 SPECIAL MEETING AND OCTOBER 18, 2010

REGULAR MEETING: County Clerk Spero stated that only the minutes for the October 12, 2010 Special Meeting were available for discussion and action today. Commissioner Fransway offered an amendment to the October 12, 2010 meeting minutes. The following motion was made by Commissioner Bell and passed unanimously:

To approve the special meeting minutes of October 12, 2010 with Commissioner Fransway's amendment.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Chairman Giordano asked for public comments. None were offered.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT:

CONSENT AGENDA: The following items were presented under the consent agenda by Administrator Deist for the Board's review/action:

1. **Request for Television/Radio Assessment Refund:** A copy of the refund certification from David Selesnick was attached for the Board's review. *Recommendation: That the Commission approve this adjustment as recommended by the TV/Communication Director.*

The following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To approve the consent agenda as presented.

SOLID WASTE MATTERS: Administrator Deist stated that he had nothing on this item.

PUBLIC LANDS PLANNING MATTERS & FORMULATION OF COUNTY POSITION ON BLM, FOREST SERVICE AND THE FEDERAL FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE PROPOSED

ACTIONS: Administrator Deist stated that he had nothing on this item.

CANVASS OF THE RETURNS FROM THE NOVEMBER 2, 2010 GENERAL ELECTION: A copy of the Summary of Votes was provided to the Board of Commissioners for their review. After review the following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To approve the canvass of the 2010 General Election votes.

MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS AND CORRESPONDENCE:

OTHER INFORMATION AND UPCOMING MEETINGS: Administrator Deist stated that Jim Jeffress had met with members of Senator Reid's staff regarding the Pine Forest Working Group recommendations and provided a report for the Board to review; he reported on the status of the process. Upcoming meetings and dates of importance were noted. Administrator Deist stated that on Friday a resignation from the Regional Planning Commission had been received from Bob Edwards so once it was determined if this was a County or City appointment advertising for the position would begin.

REPORTS FROM COMMISSIONERS REGARDING OTHER BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

THEY SERVE ON: Commissioner Fransway reported on the Airport Board meeting he had attended at the airport which involved pilots and users and discussed the proposed rules and regulations for the airport. Chairman Giordano reported on a meeting he and Administrator Deist had with BLM Winnemucca Field Office Director Gene Seidlitz and discussed information regarding Hycroft and the Sandman Project.

CLAIMS FOR EXPENDITURES OF COUNTY FUNDS: The following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To approve expenditures of County funds.

CONTINUED PUBLIC COMMENTS: Chairman Giordano stated that he was reopening public comment to allow Lynn Trost to address the Board. Ms. Trost the Field Representative for the Nevada Rural Counties Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) thanked the Commission for their support and explained what RSVP does.

REQUEST FROM THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE FOR WAIVERS TO THE ATTRITION POLICY RELATED TO THE CIVIL DEPUTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY AND A CHILD SUPPORT CASEWORKER, BOTH OF WHICH ARE CURRENTLY VACANT:

District Attorney Russell Smith and District Attorney Elect Michael Macdonald appeared before the Board. District Attorney Smith explained that in addition to Angie Elquist who left the office in October another Deputy has resigned so the office is now down two Deputy positions; he continued noting that a Child Support caseworker also resigned and noted that the State of Nevada sets the standards for the case load that can be carried per caseworker and also pays a portion of the salary so the request is for a waiver to be able to fill that position also though it is possible that the person currently hold the child support receptionist position may be moved into the caseworker position if the waiver is approved. Mr. Macdonald spoke in support of the request but advocated that the Deputy District Attorney position not be specific to "civil" so the duties can be assigned as needed and by experience; he noted that he did not have information on the child support position but remembered

from his time in the office that the State does cover some of the cost for the position. Chairman Giordano clarified that only one Deputy position is being requested; District Attorney Smith agreed. Chairman Giordano asked that each position be handled as a separate motion. The following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

To approve the waiver of the attrition policy to advertise for a Deputy D.A.

Discussion occurred regarding whether the position being advertised for is the caseworker or the receptionist position; it was determined that if the receptionist were to move into the caseworker position another request for waiver of that position would have to occur. The following motion was made by Commissioner Bell and passed unanimously:

To approve the waiver of attrition policy and to allow the District Attorney's office to fill the child support caseworker position.

REQUEST FOR WAIVER TO THE ATTRITION POLICY FOR THE POSITION OF COMPTROLLER WHICH WILL BECOME VACANT ON DECEMBER 3, 2010 AND AUTHORIZATION TO BEGIN RECRUITMENT:

Administrator Deist informed the Board that Comptroller Brooks had announced his decision to retire effective December 3, 2010 and that he was requesting that the attrition policy be waived for the hiring of this position as it is critical to Humboldt County. Commissioner Fransway agreed that the position is crucial and stated his support of the waiver; he further requested that the candidate selected be a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) and explained why he felt that should be a requirement. Administrator Deist noted that being a CPA was not required in the past and that Comptroller Brooks was not a CPA but had other skills that were necessary for government finance. Chairman Giordano stated that he would not want to see the Commission's hands tied by that requirement. Commissioner Fransway noted that there is a difference between local government accounting and private sector accounting. Chairman Giordano stated that he believed the five members of the Board could decide who would be the best choice. Commissioner Bell agreed noting that if the applicant selected was a CPA that would be a plus. After discussion the Board agreed that a CPA would be preferred but not required. The following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

To grant the request for a waiver of the attrition policy and authorize the process to begin for recruitment with preference to a CPA.

COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE: Comptroller Bruce Brooks appeared before the Board.

AUTHORIZATION FOR NEW SIGNATURE ON THE CHECKING ACCOUNT: Comptroller Brooks spoke in support of the request for authorizing another signer on the checking account to lay the groundwork

for his retirement; he noted that this would only be on an interim basis. Discussion occurred regarding who should be authorized as the other signature, what the requirements are for the signer and that liability is not an issue. Assessor Jeff Johnson appeared before the Board and agreed to be the other signature. The Board agreed. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner Bell and passed unanimously:

To authorize Jeff Johnson as the second signature on the checking account.

PRESENTATION OF THE CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT FOR EXCELLENCE IN FINANCIAL REPORTING FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2010: Chairman Giordano presented Comptroller Brooks and staff with the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting noting that this was for the seventh time. Comptroller Brooks offered his thanks.

REPORT FROM ASSESSOR JEFF JOHNSON REGARDING HIS OUT OF STATE TRAVEL: Assessor Jeff Johnson appeared before the Board and discussed the conference on pictometry he had attended in Florida noting that the class was part of the contract cost and discussed the use of pictometry in his office.

PLANNING MATTERS: Betty Lawrence, Senior Planning Technician for the Planning Department, appeared before the Board.

LP-10-07 - FINAL APPROVAL OF DIVISION OF LAND INTO LARGE PARCEL MAP SUBMITTED BY NV ENERGY ON BEHALF OF NEVADA LAND AND RESOURCE COMPANY, LLC TO DIVIDE PROPERTY LOCATED OFF OF I-80, SECTION 7 T34N, R43E, M.D.B.&M. INTO 3 PARCELS; APN #007-401-06: A copy of the Planning Department staff report and memorandum recommending approval, a copy of a map of the area and a copy of the motion for approval by the Regional Planning Commission were provided to the Board for review. Mrs. Lawrence reviewed and recommended approval with inclusion of the necessary jurats. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner Bell and passed unanimously:

To approve the final approval of LP-10-07 as recommended by staff.

SET TO PUBLIC HEARING: TH-08-02 - CREATION AND ADOPTION OF HUMBOLDT COUNTY CODE CHAPTER 16.18 - DIVISION OF LAND INTO LARGE PARCELS: Administrator Deist noted that this was a process that had been discussed by members of the RPC and the Commission at the annual retreat. The following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To set TH-08-02 to public hearing.

NEVADA STATE HEALTH DIVISION:

PRESENTATION OF DATA RELATED TO THE HEALTHY PEOPLE 2010 OBJECTIVES: Julia Peak the Manger of the Office of Epidemiology at the Nevada State Health Division and Brad Toole a Senior

Biostatistician appeared before the Board. Ms. Peak discussed what the Healthy People program entails, what the objectives are of the program including health status and access to health services, about the receipt of a grant for looking at County level data regarding leading causes of death so that if the Commission wanted to take initiatives on any of the issues that data is going to be provided at the local level and that promising practices are also being provided for review. Mr. Toole reviewed the identified leading causes of death for Humboldt County. Ms. Peak reviewed the time frame for the report and noted that when complete it would be presented to the County Commission.

CURRENT FISCAL IMPACTS RELATED TO THE COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING CLINICS:

Documents including spread sheets detailing revenues and expenditures for the Community Health Nurse Program, the services offered through the program, actual costs and contract costs for the program and the percentage of County participation were provided to the Board for review. Mary E. Wherry, RN MS Nevada State Health Division Director of Clinical Services appeared before the Board. Ms. Wherry discussed the services provided by the Community Health Nurse program, the potential effect of the upcoming legislative session on the program due to State budget issues, the requirements per statute for the Counties regarding the services provided by the program, the cost of funding those services, the possibility of using the local hospital for services if the program were cut and the issue of prioritizing prevention over treatment.

REQUEST FOR A \$5,000 CONTRIBUTION FOR THE HIGH SCHOOL RODEO CLUB: A copy of a proposed request for a cash donation of \$10,000.00 was provided to the Board by the requestor at the meeting. Mitch Tiske, Humboldt County Rodeo Club President, Deanna Pasquale Rodeo Club Secretary and Glynn Montero, Director appeared before the Board. Mr. Tiske spoke in support of the request including the benefit to the community and information about the club. Miss Pasquale detailed what the donation would be used for and what amounts would be returned to the County. Commissioner Bell noted that as agendaized the amount being requested was \$5,000.00 he asked about the increase. Administrator Deist stated that was the amount indicated in the phone call requesting that the item be placed on the agenda but the amount has varied from year to year. Mr. Montero explained what the club uses the leftover funds after the rodeo for sponsoring members to go to Nationals and the Silver State Rodeo. Discussion occurred regarding the event. Commissioner Bell questioned if the amount approved could be different then the amount stated on the agenda. District Attorney Smith stated no but if the Board wished to the item could be placed on another agenda for the additional funds. Discussion occurred regarding what other entities the group had approached for funding. Commissioner Cassinelli stated they should go to the WCVA as well. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner Bell and passed unanimously:

To approve the \$5,000 as indicated on the agenda, that the group go to the WCVA and it does not preclude them from coming back.

ACCEPTANCE OF DEED FROM THE MCDERMITT COMMUNITY BOARD FOR LAND ABUTTING COUNTY OWNED LAND WHERE THE FIRE HALL AND SUB-STATION PRESENTLY EXIST TO FACILITATE EXPANSION OF SAID BUILDING:

John Moddrell of the General Improvement District Board and the Fire District Board and Bill Macdonald appeared before the Board. Mr. Moddrell explained that the Fire District is in the process of expanding the fire hall in conjunction with the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office, the Fire Department and the McDermitt General Improvement District and there will be a corner of the building that will actually cross the piece of ground which held the original firehouse and pump #1; he continued stating that he is not on the Community Board but his understanding is that they will be approving this and that Mr. Macdonald is preparing the deed and while they are not prepared to provide the deed to the County today they would ask for approval of the acceptance in advance. Discussion occurred regarding the location of the property. The following motion was made by Commissioner Cassinelli and passed unanimously:

To accept the deed from the McDermitt Community Board for the land abutting the county owned land where the fire hall and substation exist pending on the signature from the Community Board.

Chairman Giordano recessed the meeting at 11:53 p.m. for lunch to reconvene at 1:30 p.m.

ROAD MATTERS: Road Superintendent Ben Garrett appeared before the Board.

OPTIONS FOR PURCHASE OF EQUIPMENT TRANSPORT TRAILER WHICH IS IN THE 2010-

2011 BUDGET: Superintendent Garrett explained that in the 2010-2011 budget, the Road Department had \$50,000.00 identified for an equipment transport trailer which would be utilized in the outlying areas of Denio, Orovada, McDermitt and Kings River; that the trailer would be staged at a central location for use in those areas to eliminate travel time to the Winnemucca yard and to improve mobilization efficiency as the current equipment is inadequate for transport of some equipment as the loads exceed the designed weight limits. Superintendent Garrett requested permission from the Commission to solicit bids for the purchase of the trailer. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

To authorize the Road Superintendent to go ahead with a bid for a transport trailer as requested.

REPORT OF PENDING ROAD DEPARTMENT PROJECTS: Superintendent Garrett reported on

mowing, grading, Ruby Pipeline's application of mag chloride on a portion of Dutch Flat Road and pipe installation. Superintendent Garrett explained a request which had come from the Golconda Fire District for hauling of material for a communications station that is being put in over by the Valmy Power Plant; he asked if the Commission would approve the request. Chairman Giordano asked District Attorney Smith if the item could be voted on today. Administrator Deist noted that all road matters are discussion and action. District Attorney Smith stated it would be okay. Chairman Giordano asked if that was something that needed to be done today. Superintendent Garrett stated they would like to have it done as soon as possible but he had notified them that it would require Commission approval but he hoped to get it done before the weather got worse. The following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To haul the gravel to Valmy.

Superintendent Garrett continued his report discussing the guy wire on Memory Lane and the status of the Jungo Road Project.

MISCELLANEOUS ROAD RELATED MATTERS: Discussion occurred regarding the condition of Winnemucca Mountain Road between the landfill and the shooting range, the pot holes on Herschell Road and dust issues on Feedlot Road.

MEETING BETWEEN THE HUMBOLDT COUNTY COMMISSION AND THE WINNEMUCCA CITY COUNCIL: Present on behalf of the City were Mayor DiAn Willis-Putnam, Councilmen Joyce Sheen, Rich Stone, Doug Cain, Paige Brooks and Jim Billingsley, City Clerk Eddy Davis, City Manager Steve West and City Attorney O. Kent Maher.

PRESENTATION REGARDING THE DRUG KNOWN AS "SPICE" AND POSSIBLE DIRECTION REGARDING FUTURE ACTIONS BY THE COMMISSION AND/OR COUNCIL REGARDING THIS DRUG: Sheriff Ed Kilgore and Winnemucca Police Chief Robert Davidson appeared before the Board. Sheriff Kilgore addressed the Commission and Council regarding law enforcements' concern with a drug known as SPICE. Chief Davidson commented on the need for a unified approach to combating the drug in the community. Brian Boatmen a Juvenile Probation Officer with the Elko County Juvenile Probation Department presented a power point presentation entitled "SPICE" Incense or drug? which included information regarding what SPICE is, what chemicals make up SPICE, other names by which SPICE is known, what does SPICE look like, what SPICE users experience, is SPICE use safe, how is SPICE used, is SPICE legal, what the State of Nevada is doing to address SPICE sales, use and possession and what the general public should do in response to this public health issue. Discussion occurred regarding the challenge of listing the drug as a controlled substance, the challenge of testing for the drug, the need for

education and the need for action by the Nevada Legislature to help address the issue. Commissioner Fransway suggested an avenue that might be considered was that beginning on November 17th the Nevada Association of Counties (NACO) would be meeting in Reno and the Board of Directors would be in session, he asked if Officer Boatman would be willing to give the presentation to NACO; Officer Boatman stated he would. Commissioner Fransway continued noting NACO has a lot of pull and is very well respected by the Legislature as is their partner the Nevada League of Cities and something done by those organizations could have statewide ramifications so he offered to try and get the matter agendaized for that meeting. Dr. Dave Jensen Assistant Superintendent for the Humboldt County School District discussed what the school district is doing in relation to SPICE. Judge Michael R Montero discussed the issue as it effects the Sixth Judicial Drug Court program. Discussion occurred regarding the businesses in town who sell the product and possible actions which could be taken to discourage the sales including a letter to the businesses. Commissioner Fransway stated that he believes it is premature to draft any resolutions or ordinances at this point but it would not be premature to pursue it seriously. Commissioner Fransway offered the following motion:

That the County work with the City through staff and legal counsel to seek the best option in dealing with SPICE as a dangerous drug and a threat to public safety in our community.

Councilman Sheen felt the motion was sufficient at this time but asked if wording could be added or an agreement be reached between the entities that they will follow up on the matter within a certain amount of time. Commissioner Fransway amended his previous motion as follows:

That the County work with the City through staff and legal counsel to seek the best option in dealing with SPICE as a dangerous drug and a threat to public safety in our community in an expedient manner.

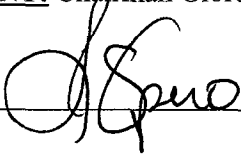

Councilman Brooks asked if the motion includes an aggressive letter to the businesses who are selling the product. Chairman Giordano and Commissioner Cassinelli agreed it would be good if that could be done as the City has the power. Councilman Sheen suggested language to be included in the motion regarding the drafting of the letter. Commissioner Fransway responded that he believed that legal should determine if that is okay and that is why he put in the reference to working with legal counsel and suggested that it might be premature for a letter. Discussion occurred regarding the difficulties with doing a letter at this time. Chairman Giordano called Commissioner Fransway's motion to a vote and it passed unanimously. Councilman Sheen offered a motion mirroring Commissioner Fransway's motion with the addition that the City would research what would be appropriate to go into a letter to be sent to local businesses to try and

discourage sales. Chief Davidson discussed the letter and who should sign the letter. Discussion occurred regarding the language of the letter. Mayor Willis-Putnam called Councilman Sheen's motion to a vote and it passed unanimously.

Mayor Willis-Putnam adjourned the City Council portion of the meeting at 2:47 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Chairman Giordano asked for public comments. None were offered.

ADJOURNMENT: Chairman Giordano adjourned the meeting at 2:49 p.m.
