

Monday, June 18, 2012

The regular meeting of the Humboldt County Board of Commissioners was called to order on Monday, June 18, 2012, at 9:30 a.m. in the regular place of meeting at the Courthouse, Winnemucca, Nevada. Those present were Chairman Mike Bell, Commissioners Jim French, Dan Cassinelli, Tom Fransway and Garley Amos Jr., District Attorney Michael Macdonald, Administrator Bill Deist and Clerk of the Board Tami Rae Spero.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Chairman Bell asked for public comments. Dee Holzel addressed the Board regarding the consideration by the Winnemucca Convention and Visitors Authority of purchasing the Winnemucca Hotel with the possible assistance of the County Commission and her support of that purchase for the benefit of the people of Humboldt County.

DISCUSSION & ACTION ON CORRECTION/APPROVAL OF MINUTES - JUNE 4, 2012

REGULAR MEETING: No minutes provided for consideration.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT:

CONSENT AGENDA: The following items were presented under the consent agenda by Administrator Deist for the Board's review/action:

1. Approval of amendment to the pictometry contract: A copy of the amendment had been provided to the Board for review. *Recommendation: that the Commission authorizes the Chairman to sign the amendment.*
2. Request for adjustment to the Humboldt County Real Property Tax Roll: *Recommendation: That the Commission approves the request as recommended by the Assessor and Treasurer.*
3. Approval of the quarterly CDBG Report: *Recommendation: That the Commission authorizes the Chairman's signature.*
4. Request for extension related to the Senior Center Expansion Design Planning Grant: *Recommendation: That the Commission authorizes the Chairman to sign the letter requesting the extension.*

The following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

SOLID WASTE MATTERS: Administrator Deist stated that he had nothing on this item.

PUBLIC LANDS PLANNING MATTERS & FORMULATION OF COUNTY POSITION ON BLM, FOREST SERVICE AND THE FEDERAL FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE PROPOSED

ACTIONS: Administrator Deist stated that he had nothing on this item.

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MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS AND CORRESPONDENCE:

OTHER INFORMATION AND UPCOMING MEETINGS: Administrator Deist informed the Board that the new Commission Room sound system was being installed July 18th through the 20th, that 1.6 million had been received in PILT funding and that the tour of the Douglas County weed facility had been conducted; he provided a handout related to the tour for the Board to review. Commissioner Fransway requested that the information be copied and provided to each of the Commissioners for review.

REPORTS FROM COMMISSIONERS REGARDING OTHER BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

THEY SERVE ON: None offered.

CLAIMS FOR EXPENDITURES OF COUNTY FUNDS: The following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To approve the claims for expenditures of County funds as presented.

COUNTY CLERK'S OFFICE: County Clerk Tami Rae Spero was present.

CANVASSING OF THE RESULTS FOR THE JUNE 12, 2012 PRIMARY ELECTION: A copy of the Statement of Votes for the June 12, 2012 Primary Election had been provided to the Board for review. The following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

To certify the primary vote of June 12, 2012 as requested by the Clerk.

REQUEST FROM THE COUNTY CLERK FOR PRE-APPROVED OVERTIME FOR THE NEXT 6 MONTHS FOR THE INDIGENT COORDINATOR (10 HOURS) AND COURT CLERK

(20 HOURS): Administrator Deist noted that this is the same request that is made every six months by the Clerk for these positions. The following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

To approve.

PRESENTATION ON THE UPDATED SANTA ROSA DISTRICT TRAVEL MANAGEMENT

PLAN: District Ranger Jeff Ulrich appeared before the Board and reviewed the proposed amendments to the travel management plan noting that there would be three upcoming open houses to allow for public input. Discussion ensued regarding the proposed changes, that a list of roads involved would be typed up and provided to the Board, what had occurred related to preventing the removal of the fire engine in Paradise Valley and that Ranger Ulrich would come before back before the Commission as to the travel plan once the open houses had occurred.

PLANNING MATTERS: Betty Lawrence, Senior Planning Technician for the Planning Department appeared before the Board.

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VH-12-14 - A variance request submitted by Charlie Duncan to reduce the required side yard set back from the fifteen (15) feet to five (5) feet in the RR-1.25 (Single Family Residential 1.25 acre minimum lot size) zoning district in order to allow construction of a garage on the existing house:

A copy of the Planning Department Staff Report recommending approval, a copy of the variance application with map and a copy of the Notice of Public Hearing were provided to the Commission for review. Mrs. Lawrence reviewed the application and recommended approval. The following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To approve the variance request VH-12-14 per staff recommendation.

FIXING THE MINIMUM COMPENSATION OF THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE FOR THE ENSUING TERM PER NRS 4.040: Administrator Deist asked that this item be tabled until the next meeting as per statute it cannot occur until July. The following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

That due to NRS 4.040 that the Board tables this item until the July 9th meeting.

COMPTROLLER/AUDITOR'S OFFICE: Comptroller Sondra Schmidt appeared before the Board.

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION LEVYING FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013 TAX RATES: A copy of the proposed resolution and a break out of the 2012-2013 tax rates were provided to the Board for review. Comptroller Schmidt noted that there had been no changes to the tax rate and requested approval. Discussion occurred regarding the combined tax rate. Commissioner Fransway questioned language in the tax rate break out and discussion occurred. Commissioner Fransway suggested that it should read "combined tax rate" rather than "combined city rate"; the Board concurred. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner Cassinelli and passed unanimously:

To approve with the change of the wording to "combined tax rate".

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION AUGMENTING REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION FUND: A

copy of the Notice of Augmentation and a copy of the proposed resolution were provided to the Board for review. Comptroller Schmidt reviewed the request and asked for approval. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner French and passed unanimously:

To accept the adoption of the resolution to augment the Regional Transportation Fund.

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION AUGMENTING THE QUINN RIVER TV DISTRICT FUND: A

copy of the proposed resolution with revenue/expenses information was provided to the Board for review.

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Comptroller Schmidt reviewed the request and asked for approval. The following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To adopt the resolution augmenting the Quinn River TV District Fund.

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION AUGMENTING THE DRUG COURT FUND: A copy of the proposed resolution with revenue/expenses information was provided to the Board for review. Comptroller Schmidt reviewed the request and asked for approval. The following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To adopt the resolution augmenting the Drug Court Fund.

APPROVAL OF FY 2011-2012 BUDGET TRANSFERS: A detail of the budget transfers was provided to the Board for review. Comptroller Schmidt reviewed the request. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To approve fiscal year 11 and 12 budget transfers.

APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION ADOPTING HUMBOLDT COUNTY COMMITTED FUND BALANCE: A copy of the proposed resolution was provided to the Board for review. Comptroller Schmidt reviewed the request. The following motion was made by Commissioner Cassinelli and passed unanimously:

To approve the resolution adopting Humboldt County Committed Fund balance.

APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION ADOPTING HUMBOLDT COUNTY COMMITTED FUND BALANCE FOR IN-LIEU TRUST FUND: A copy of the proposed resolution was provided to the Board for review. Comptroller Schmidt reviewed the request. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

To approve the resolution for committed in-lieu tax fund.

BOARD APPOINTMENTS:

DENIO TV MAINTENANCE DISTRICT (5 VACANCIES): No applications received.

GOLCONDA WATER DISTRICT (1 VACANCY): No applications received.

OROVADA GENERAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT (1 VACANCY): No applications received.

PARADISE VALLEY SEWER DISTRICT (2 VACANCIES): No applications received.

QUINN RIVER TV MAINTENANCE DISTRICT (4 VACANCIES): No applications received.

PARADISE VALLEY WEED CONTROL DISTRICT (1 VACANCY): Two requests for appointment had been received - Dave Buckingham and Tony Lesperance. Commissioner Cassinelli stated that Mr. Buckingham had been unable to attend today's meeting. Mr. Lesperance appeared before the Board and was interviewed. Commissioner Fransway offered comments in favor of appointing Mr. Lesperance. Gary Bengochea appeared before the Board and spoke in support of appointing Mr. Lesperance. Commissioner Cassinelli offered comments opposing the appointment of Mr. Lesperance and supporting the appointment of Mr. Buckingham as one of the largest land owners in the District. Discussion ensued between the Board and Mr. Bengochea (from the audience) regarding issues with billing and chemical purchases. Daryl Riersgard, Weed District Coordinator, appeared before the Board and addressed the concerns voiced by Mr. Bengochea and offered comment on the appointment of Mr. Buckingham. Commissioner French stated that he would like to interview Mr. Buckingham before making a decision. Chairman Bell concurred. Discussion occurred regarding the ability to delay the decision until Mr. Buckingham could be interviewed, the billing issues noted and the spraying of private properties and how that is billed. Commissioner French requested that this appointment be postponed until the Board is able to meet with Mr. Buckingham. Commissioner Cassinelli concurred. The following motion was made by Commissioner French and passed with Chairman Bell and Commissioners French, Cassinelli and Amos voting aye and Commissioner Fransway voting nay:

To postpone the appointment to the Paradise Valley Weed Control District until the next meeting.

PUEBLO RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT (3 VACANCIES): A request for appointment had been received from Robert C. Putney. The following motion was made by Commissioner Cassinelli and passed unanimously:

To appoint Mr. Putney to the Pueblo Fire Protection District.

LIBRARY BOARD (2 VACANCIES): Two requests for appointment had been received - Sean Wilson, Susan Putnam and one request for re-appointment had been received - Debbie Stone. The following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

To re-appoint Debbie Stone and appoint Susan Putnam to the Library Board.

AG. DISTRICT 3 (3 VACANCIES): A request for re-appointment had been received from Dave Louk. The following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To re-appoint Dave Louk to the Ag 3 Board and to table the other two vacancies until

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next meeting if there are any applicants.

REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION (1 VACANCY): A request for re-appointment had been received from Stephen Nye. Mr. Nye appeared before the Board and requested re-appointment. The following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

To re-appoint Mr. Nye to the RPC.

ADVISORY BOARD TO MANAGE WILDLIFE: A request for re-appointment had been received from Larry Allen. The following motion was made by Commissioner French and passed unanimously:

To accept the application for re-appointment from Larry Allen for the Advisory Board to Manage Wildlife.

ROAD MATTERS: Road Superintendent Ben Garrett appeared before the Board.

REQUEST FOR PLACEMENT OF MAG ON SAND PASS ROAD IN DESERT VALLEY: A copy of a memo from the Road Superintendent regarding work on Sand Pass Road requested by Mr. Smith and a copy of the proposed agreement were provided to the Board for review. A letter opposing the request from Betes family was provided to the Board. Superintendent Garrett reviewed the request from Mr. Smith for the application of magnesium chloride to the section of Sand Pass Road from Mr. Smith's drive way to one mile west of the cattle guard nearest to Highway 95 including the scope of the work, the cost to the County and Mr. Smith's offer to pay the material costs and the cost for a water truck if the County supplies the labor and equipment for the project; he detailed his concerns related to the product being slippery during wet times and the effect on traffic on the road during winter months including the book mobile and concerns voiced by road users regarding those issues. Superintendent Garrett's recommendation was to continue with application of gravel base material to the road way. Commissioner Amos noted that other residents in the area are opposed to the application of mag on this road. Commissioner Fransway asked that a copy of the Betes letter of opposition be included in the record (see attached). Gary Bengochea appeared before the Board and spoke in opposition to the request due to safety concerns in the winter months; he noted that the offer was a nice gesture but that Mr. Smith did not reside in the area in the winter months. Superintendent Garrett commented that a similar request had been considered in 2009 and had been denied. The following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

To due to the public opinion on Sand Pass Road, due to the safety concerns that the Commission declines to accept the offer from Mr. Smith to mag chloride the road.

REQUEST FROM THE BLM FOR ASSISTANCE IN IMPROVING THE ROAD TO BILKS

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CREEK RESERVOIR: Gene Seidlitz, Director Winnemucca BLM Field Office appeared before the Board. Superintendent Garrett explained that he had received a call from John Etcheverry of the BLM requesting the County Road Department's assistance to improve the road to Bilks Creek Reservoir, BLM has the funding but is seeking help with equipment and manpower and the project is tentatively scheduled for mid-July. Director Seidlitz explained that currently this is only a request and gave some background information on the proposed project including other assistance being requested from other BLM offices and potential issues in obtaining that assistance due to the fire season; he noted this is just a request to the Commissioners seeking possible assistance in mid-July from the County Road Department in terms of labor and equipment to assist with that project. Commissioner Amos stated he saw no problem with the request as long as the Road Department is capable and has the time to do so. The Board concurred. Director Seidlitz noted that this project would be done on a purchase order or sole source contract to cover costs of labor or equipment from the County, the expectation is not that it would be done free of charge. The following motion was made by Commissioner Fransway and passed unanimously:

To grant the request from the BLM to assist them in improving the Bilks Creek Reservoir Road.

REPORT OF PENDING ROAD DEPARTMENT PROJECTS: Superintendent Garrett updated the Board on road grading, the chip seal project, the installation of the power pump out on Jungo Road and the book mobile. Discussion occurred regarding grindings and the chip seal.

MISCELLANEOUS ROAD RELATED MATTERS: None offered.

Chairman Bell recessed the meeting for lunch at 11:59 a.m. to reconvene at 1:30 p.m.

APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT WITH THE FORT MCDERMITT PAIUTE AND SHOSHONE TRIBE FOR HUMBOLDT COUNTY TO PERFORM BUILDING INSPECTION SERVICES FOR THE PROPOSED TRAVEL PLAZA ON THE FORT MCDERMITT RESERVATION:

Building & Safety Director Bobby Thomas appeared before the Board. District Attorney Macdonald addressed the Board explaining that upon contact by the Tribe regarding this request a proposed Memorandum of Understanding had been drafted which he, the Administrator, Pool/Pact and an attorney familiar with Pool/Pact and Tribal contracts had reviewed; that certain inclusions related to including the County and its agents in any insurance policy obtained during the construction phase had been added and that agreement was now being presented to the Board for consideration. District Attorney Macdonald noted that there is no obligation for the Tribe to request these services as to inspection, they are doing this voluntarily and want to be treated as any other property owner including the payment of fees which he

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stated is both a benefit to the Tribe and to the County; he offered the recommendation that the Board authorize the Chairman to sign the agreement. Commissioner Fransway questioned whether the payment of the fees will include travel costs. Building Official Thomas stated that the current policy does not charge travel for anyone who obtains permits but that there are certain dedicated days when the Inspector travels to those areas of the County to perform the required duties. Commissioner Fransway observed that would be for areas within the Building Official's jurisdiction which the Reservation is not therefore to be fair an additional mileage cost should be included in the agreement. Building Official Thomas responded that there is a mechanism in place to charge an additional fee if travel to the site is required on a day other than the dedicated day and that both the builder and owner are aware of that but there is nothing in policy to put an outlying trip charge on an inspection if it is on a dedicated day; he also noted that he had an issue with charging an additional cost when they could do this project without any involvement by his department or requirement to meet any regulations. Discussion occurred regarding the number of inspections that would be required; that the fees associated with the project should cover those costs, the difficulty of breaking out the cost for the one project if multiple inspections are occurring and what else is incorporated in the trip to the outlying areas. Administrator Deist noted that it is outstanding that the Tribe has come to the County and requested this service on a project this size when it is not required as, even though this is on the Reservation, it will have significant use by the public and the safety and welfare of that public significantly outweighs any fees the County may receive. Chairman Bell concurred. Commissioner Fransway asked if there would be a responsibility by the County if something happens at the location because the County provided the inspection. District Attorney Macdonald noted that is a potential issue on any project but that based on information obtained the County's liability insurance would cover the situation. The following motion was made by Commissioner French and passed unanimously:

To accept the Memorandum of Understanding between Humboldt County and the Fort McDermitt Paiute Shoshone Tribe for services from the Building Department for inspections on the travel plaza construction project.

REVIEW AND POSSIBLE AWARD OF BID FOR THE NEW DISPATCH/COMMUNICATION

CENTER: Administrator Deist informed the Board that five bids had been received for the new dispatch/communication center project but all are higher than the estimate so he would looking in the reasons for that and possible cost savings; he requested that the Commission do nothing at this time to allow time to identify savings or additional revenue sources. Discussion occurred regarding the amount

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the bids were over by, the ramifications of not proceeding with the project, the fact that the project will not get less expensive by waiting to do the project and the time frame within which the bids would need to be accepted or rejected. The Board agreed that the project must be done and that the funds would need to be identified. Administrator Deist stated the item would be brought back at the next meeting. The Board concurred. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed unanimously:

To table this agenda item on the dispatch/communication center until the next regular meeting, the first meeting in July, to try and come up with a solution to get this communication center built.

REQUEST FROM THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE FOR A WAIVER TO THE COUNTY ATTRITION POLICY TO FILL AN UPCOMING PATROL POSITION VACANCY:

Sheriff Ed Kilgore appeared before the Board. Sheriff Kilgore explained that Carol Duncan had recently left her position at the Detention Center which had resulted in a transfer of a patrol Deputy to the Detention Center thereby resulting in a vacancy in patrol; he requested a waiver of the attrition policy to fill the position. Commissioner French clarified that this was a public safety position. The Sheriff confirmed that it was. The following motion was made by Commissioner French and passed unanimously:

To waive the 90 day attrition policy to allow the Sheriff to fill the position.

REQUEST FROM THE SUMMIT LAKE PAIUTE TRIBE TO ACQUIRE ASSESSOR'S PARCEL NUMBERS 01-252-03 AND 01-252-04 PURSUANT TO NRS 361.604 THAT ARE CURRENTLY HELD IN TRUST BY THE HUMBOLDT COUNTY TREASURER:

Provided to the Board for review was a copy of a letter from Randi DeSoto Council Chairman for the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe, a copy of the language of NRS 361.604, a map of the area and an e-mail from Gina Rackley, Humboldt County Treasurer explaining the situation (all items attached). Aaron Peskin representing the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe, Tribal Council Vice-Chair Delgadina Gonzalez and Council member Jerry Bell and County Treasurer Gina Rackley appeared before the Board. Mr. Peskin addressed the Board and spoke in support of the request to acquire the parcels. Administrator Deist offered the recommendation that the request be granted. Treasurer Rackley reviewed the history of this matter including how the County had acquired the parcels and what had occurred over the years with the efforts to release them. District Attorney Macdonald noted that if the Board approved the request the documentation to accomplish the task would be prepared and brought back before the Board for approval. Mr. Peskin explained what would occur on the Tribe's side. The following motion was made by Commissioner

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Amos and passed unanimously:

To authorize the conveyance of deed to the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe and to allow the District Attorney to execute the necessary documents.

*** Chairman Bell exited at 2:25 p.m. and turned the meeting over to Vice-Chairman French.*

ANNUAL PERFORMANCE REVIEW OF THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR AND POSSIBLE ADOPTION OF A RESOLUTION SETTING THE COMPENSATION FOR APPOINTED

OFFICIALS: A copy of the proposed resolution was provided to the Board for review. Administrator Deist noted that the review of the County Administrator must be conducted at a public meeting per statute. Vice-Chairman French commented that he had not had the chance to review any written documentation related to the Administrator's review and he would think it would be appropriate for the Board to set aside that portion of this item until the next meeting as in the past the Board has had documentation to review but that it would be alright to proceed with the other portion of this item related to approving the resolution granting cost of living adjustments for approved Humboldt County Officials. Discussion occurred regarding why the Administrator's self evaluation had not been provided, what the amount of the cost of living adjustment was, who the resolution applied to and how to include the Administrator's information in the resolution prior to actual review. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner Amos and passed with Vice-Chairman French and Commissioners Cassinelli, Fransway and Amos voting aye and Chairman Bell being absent:



To approve the resolution and authorize the Chair to sign including the County Administrator.



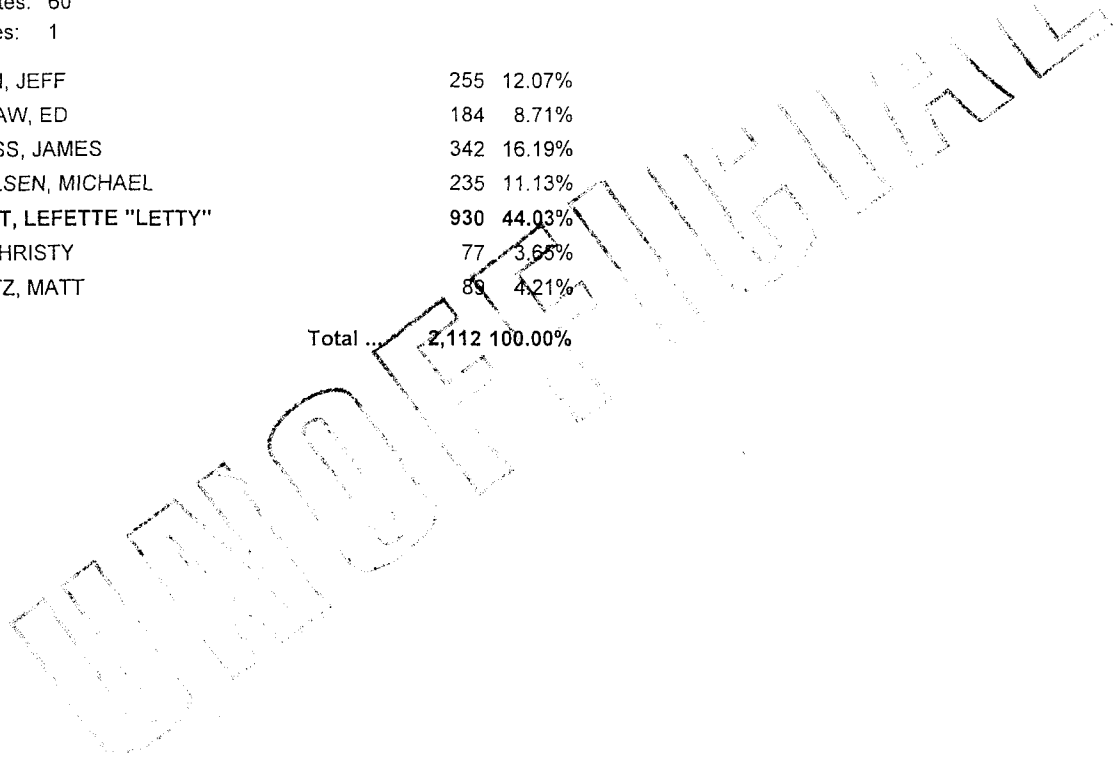
