

Monday, January 4, 2016

The regular meeting of the Humboldt County Board of Commissioners was called to order on Monday, January 4, 2016, at 9:30 a.m. in the regular place of meeting at the Courthouse, Winnemucca, Nevada. Those present were Chairman Garley Amos, Jr., Commissioners Marlene Brissenden, Mike Bell, Jim French and Ron Cerri, Deputy District Attorney Gabrielle Carr, Administrator Dave Mendiola and Clerk of the Board Tami Rae Spero.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Chairman Amos asked for public comments. Lewis Trout offered comment related to other items that would need to be included on the agenda for the special meeting in Paradise Valley including discussion about the creation of an assessment district, having the voters weigh in on the issue, the offer of dedication of the building when constructed and the standards and what is evaluated when the County takes dedication of a facility. Chairman Amos asked for further public comment; none offered.

DISCUSSION & ACTION ON CORRECTION/APPROVAL OF MINUTES - SEPTEMBER 21, 2015, OCTOBER 5, 2015, OCTOBER 19, 2015, NOVEMBER 2, 2015, NOVEMBER 16, 2015, DECEMBER 7, 2015 & DECEMBER 21, 2015 REGULAR MEETINGS AND OCTOBER 15, 2015

SPECIAL MEETING: No minutes presented for consideration.

FIX THE TERM OF THE CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIRMAN: Commissioners Brissenden and French voiced their support for fixing the term at one year as it has been in the past. The following motion was made by Commissioner Brissenden and passed unanimously:

To fix the term of Chair and Vice-Chairman at one year.

ELECTION OF CHAIR: Commissioner French nominated Commissioner Brissenden for the position of chairman for 2016 and offered the following motion which passed unanimously:

To elect Commissioner Brissenden as Chairman for year 2016.

ELECTION OF VICE-CHAIR: Commissioner Cerri nominated Commissioner Bell for the position of vice-chairman for 2016 and offered the following motion which passed unanimously:

To elect Mike Bell as Vice-Chairman.

Commissioner Amos handed the meeting over to Commissioner Brissenden. Commissioner French thanked Commissioner Amos for his service as Chairman in 2015.

DETERMINATION OF COMMISSION ASSIGNMENTS FOR 2016: A list of the proposed assignments was attached to the agenda for review. Administrator Mendiola noted that the proposed assignments are the same as what was adopted in 2015 and asked if the Commissioners would like to make any changes. Commissioner Cerri asked if the Nevada Management Task Force of which he is a member is still needed or if it could be taken off. Commissioner French offered to check with NACO to see if the committee has any future functions. Commissioner Cerri agreed to remain on the task force if it is still functioning. Chairman Brissenden noted that she serves on the Western Nevada Development District. Administrator Mendiola stated that he would add that to the assignment listing. Audience member Lewis Trout asked about the Commission having an appointee on the Airport Board. The Commission agreed to put that item on a future agenda. Commissioner French noted that he is a member of the Western Interstate Region and asked that it also be included on the assignment listing. The following motion was made by Commissioner French and passed unanimously:

To approve the assignments presented as amended.

APPOINTMENT(S) TO THE DEBT MANAGEMENT COMMISSION: County Clerk Spero explained that Richard Robie had tendered his resignation from the Debt Management Commission so the request would be to appoint Kent Mowry to finish out the term which will end on December 31st. The following motion was made by Commissioner Cerri and passed unanimously:

To appoint Kent Mowry to the County's Debt Management Commission.

RETREAT PLANNING (SCHEDULED FOR JANUARY 25, 2016): A memo from the Administrator offering recommendations for the items to be included for discussion at the Retreat was attached to the agenda for review. Administrator Mendiola reviewed his recommendations including overall goals for the county, safety issues, asset management plan for the County, grants and management of capital projects. Discussion occurred regarding the location for the retreat and the Commission agreed to hold it at the Cooperative Extension meeting room. Commissioner French asked that discussion regarding a maintenance schedule for the buildings be included. Discussion ensued regarding the start time and the Commission agreed to keep it at 9:30 a.m. for consistency. The following motion was made by Commissioner French and passed unanimously:

To accept the amended list of items that will be discussed within the retreat as presented and also to set the time at 9:30 for the retreat to start at the Cooperative Extension Office.

ROAD MATTERS: Road Superintendent Ben Garrett appeared before the Commission.

REPORT OF PENDING ROAD DEPARTMENT PROJECTS: The agenda noted that this item would include maintenance details of grading, chip seal, cattle guards, bridges and culverts as well as any new road projects. Superintendent Garrett reported on snow plowing. Discussion ensued regarding the snow removal equipment and the hiring process for the position recently approved.

COMMUNICATIONS/TV DISTRICT:

CONSIDERATION OF AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF A REQUEST TO REPAIR THE

COUNTY SNOW CAT: It was noted that currently the tires have been damaged as are the tracks and the estimated cost to repair is \$30,000.00. Attached to the agenda for review were photos of the damage to the Snow Cat and a quote from Peterson Equipment for the repairs. Administrator Mendiola explained that this information had been provided by Ric Grantham of the Communications Department and that the damage is caused by exposure to heat and sun as the equipment is not covered or shielded in the area it is stored at; he reviewed the photos and the damage depicted for the Commission. Administrator Mendiola noted that the quote received from Peterson Equipment \$18,280.00 rather than the \$30,000.00 quoted in the past; he explained the need for this piece of equipment. Discussion occurred regarding how many tires need replacement. Road Superintendent Ben Garrett noted the cost for the foam fill quoted and suggested that it may be able to be acquired locally so only the tires and tracks would need to be obtained from Peterson although even the tires might be available locally; he also stated that the County could do the labor. Commissioner Bell asked if the equipment is worth the investment given its age. Superintendent Garrett reviewed the repairs done which have been minimal since 2000 and discussed

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what the cost of the equipment would be new. Discussion occurred regarding the need for the equipment, the lack of alternatives when access to the mountain sites occurs during heavy snow periods and the need to shield the equipment to help to prevent future damage with the understanding that the tires do have a shelf life no matter how the equipment is housed. Commissioner French asked if the budget could handle the additional cost. Administrator Mendiola explained that as the cost would be shared between Communications and the TV District it was doable. The Board agreed that would be appropriate. Deputy District Attorney Carr asked if a second bid was received. Administrator Mendiola responded that other requests were sent out but no responses had been received as of yet but, if a lower bid is received, that one would be accepted or if, as the Road Superintendent suggested, the service could be sourced locally and result in a cost savings, bids would be obtained from those sources as well. Deputy District Attorney Carr explained that per NRS in this cost range, two bids must be solicited. Commissioner Bell suggested that the Commission could approve the request up to the \$18,280.00 today and if something comes in less that would be great. The following motion was made by Commissioner Bell and passed unanimously:

To approve the repair to the snow cat, not to exceed the cost of \$18,280.92 and to direct the Road Superintendent to try and have this done locally but that would be at his discretion.

TREASURER: Treasurer Gina Rackley appeared before the Commission.

CONSIDERATION OF AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL FROM THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO DESIGNATE THE ATTACHED PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES AS UNCOLLECTIBLE AS THEY HAVE BEEN DELINQUENT FOR 3-YEARS OR MORE AND ALL APPROPRIATE PROCEDURES HAVE BEEN FOLLOWED AND HAVE PROVED UNSUCCESSFUL PER NRS 361.5607:

Attached to the agenda for review was a list identifying the accounts that have been designated as having taxes on personal property that is uncollectible as allowed by NRS 361.5607 (see attached). Treasurer Rackley reviewed the request for the Commission noting that all of the entities listed are mining companies that are no longer in business. After discussion the following motion was made by Commissioner French and passed unanimously:

To accept the recommendation on the part of the Treasurer to designate the attached personal property taxes as uncollectible as they have been delinquent for three or more years.

NUISANCE COMPLAINT STATUS UPDATE, DISCUSSION & REVIEW OF THE STATUS OF THE NUISANCE AT 4215 WALTHER LANE ON THE PROPERTY OWNED BY JOHANN LYON TO DETERMINE WHETHER TO TAKE FURTHER ACTION OR CLOSE OR DISMISS

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THIS CASE: The agenda noted the County Administrator had been requested to send a letter to Mrs. Lyon requesting that cleanup of the property, specifically the badly damaged trailer, be completed by December 31, 2015; the letter was sent on approximately November 1, 2015; potential action may include making the cost of abatement a special assessment against the real property, to determine assessment of costs of abatement in accordance with County Code 8.04.080 and provide direction to the District Attorney for further legal action to abate the nuisance or other action necessary to abate said nuisance. A copy of the letter sent by the County Administrator to Mrs. Lyon was provided as part of the agenda for review. Chairman Brissenden noted that she had visited the site and that while a metal panel fence had been put up, items were still on the site. Administrator Mendiola stated that he had visited the property which had been fenced and cleanup had occurred on the eastern side of the property with continued work being done on removing more items; he further noted that the Building Official had visited the site this morning and estimated that 90% of the nuisance had been abated. Discussion occurred regarding the items identified in the original complaint and the lack of contact by the complainant. Commissioner French agreed that a good faith effort was occurring but suggested that the Commission should still follow up to make sure it is completed. Chairman Brissenden suggested that this review be continued out thirty days to make sure the property owners complete the cleanup. Commissioner French asked that the Building Official review the property within thirty days and provide a report to the Commission. The following motion was made by Commissioner Bell and passed unanimously:

To continue this nuisance complaint for another thirty days and give the Commission another update at that time.

CONSIDERATION OF AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF THE ELK MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR HUMBOLDT COUNTY:

The agenda noted that Ed Partee of the Nevada Department of Wildlife and Eddie Booth, Chairman of the Elk Management Committee will provide an update of the plan to the Commission. A copy of the Humboldt County Elk Management Sub-Plan Draft 4 (12/18/15) was attached to the agenda for review. Mr. Partee and Mr. Booth appeared before the Commission. Mr. Partee reviewed the process to this point as well as the draft Sub-Plan provided. Discussion ensued regarding the purpose of the plan, the number of meetings still to be held and the manner in which comments or recommendations can be provided prior to the submission of the plan to the State. No action was taken on this item but Commissioner French asked that further discussion be agendized for the first meeting in April.

CONSIDERATION OF AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING JANUARY AS NATIONAL RADON ACTION MONTH:

It was noted that due to technical

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difficulties this item did not appear on the website agenda but was included on the agenda posted. Chairman Brissenden read the language of the proposed resolution. The following motion was made by Commissioner Bell and passed unanimously:

To adopt the resolution proclaiming January as National Radon Action Month.

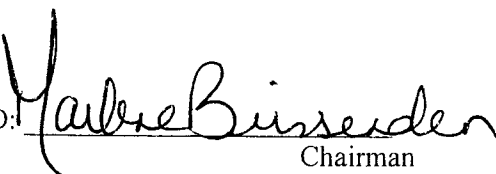
CONSIDERATION OF & POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF FINAL DRAFT COMMENTS LETTER PREPARED BY THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR FOR THE PURPOSE OF COMMENTING ON THE PROPOSED WITHDRAWAL APPLICATION ("NOTICE OF PROPOSED WITHDRAWAL; SAGEBRUSH FOCAL AREAS; IDAHO, MONTANA, NEVADA, OREGON, UTAH AND WYOMING AND NOTICE OF INTENT TO PREPARE AN ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT") BY THE BLM POSTED ON SEPTEMBER 24, 2015:

The agenda noted that this notice temporarily segregates the withdrawal lands for up to two years while the application is processed & that comments are due by January 14, 2016. Commissioner French explained that he had provided a rough draft of the issues that he has identified following work with the NACO staff and the Nevada Mining Association to the Commissioners for review but he noted that he does not view these comments as the final but just as a good start. Commissioner French requested that action be taken relative to these items and to authorize him to complete the letter with the County Commissioner before the 14th; he noted the possibility of additional items being added based on information received from the Nevada Mining Association regarding mineral withdrawal and asked the Commissioners to provide him with any comments they would like to see included. Commissioner Cerri asked if there would be an opportunity to approve the final during the special meeting on January 11th? Deputy District Attorney Carr agreed that it could be added to the agenda. The Commission agreed to add the item to that agenda.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Chairman Brissenden asked for public comments. County Clerk Spero informed the Commission that Friday, January 8th would be Anita Paquette, the Indigent Coordinator's last day as she was retiring and that there would be a gathering in the Meeting Room at 3:30 p.m. to recognize Mrs. Paquette. No further public comment offered.

ANNUAL INSPECTION OF HUMBOLDT COUNTY DETENTION CENTER BY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS: Chairman Brissenden noted that the Commission would be doing the annual inspection of the Detention Center immediately following this meeting and recessed the meeting at 11:19 a.m. to reconvene at that site.

ADJOURNMENT: Chairman Brissenden adjourned the meeting at 12:30 p.m. at the County Detention Center.
